What if we would add other 50 countries of Mama Africa ...

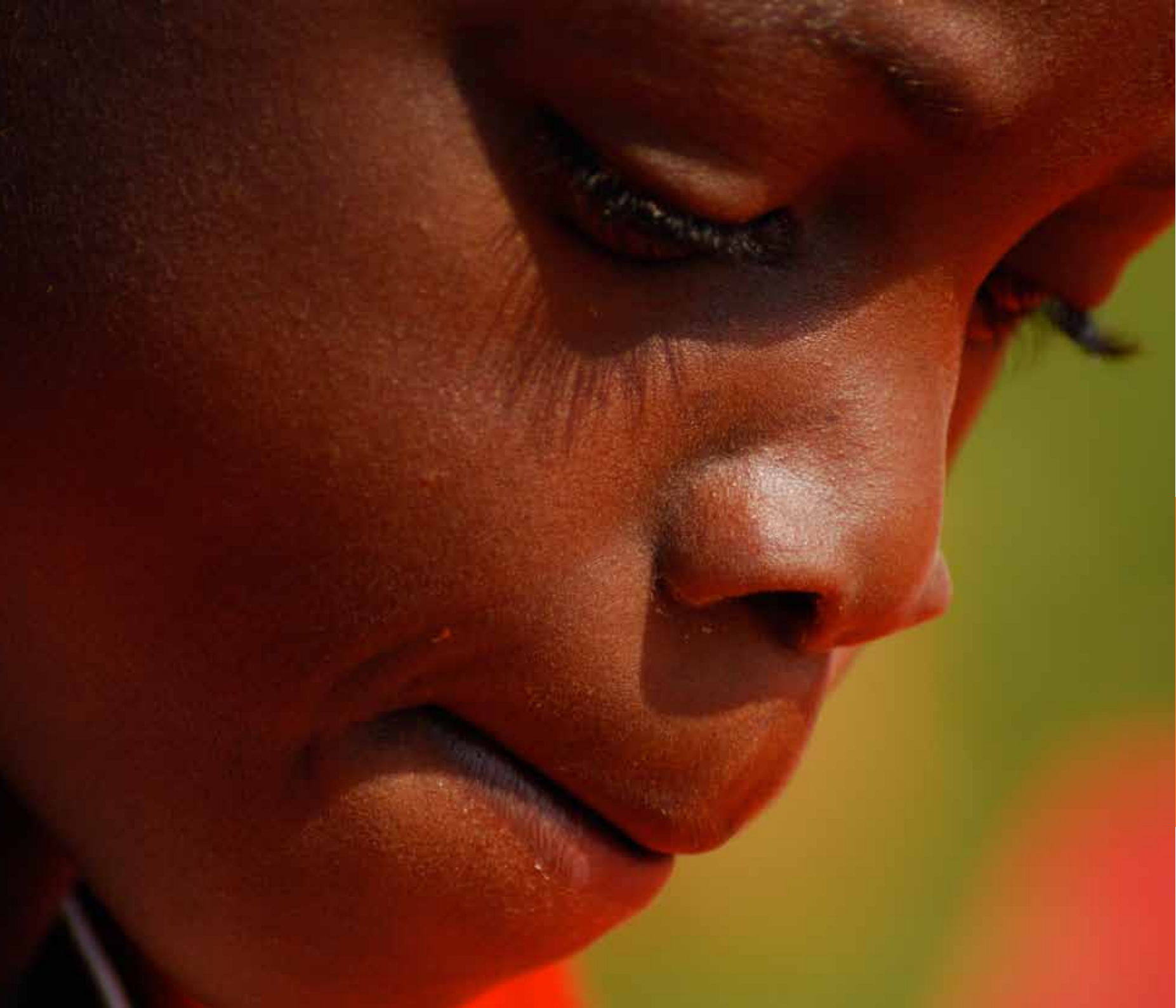




Our ultimate mission
